VIRTUAL EXECUTIVE LEADERSHIP PROGRAM (VELP)

Emerging leaders at the EX-01/ Director level who are committed to public service excellence and to exploring complex topics and how they relate to the public service

DIGITAL EXECUTIVE LEADERSHIP PROGRAM (DELP)

EX-01 or EX-02/Director or Senior Director level executives, Managers, Senior Advisors/Specialists (EX minus 1 e.g. CS-04, EC-07).

STEPPING INTO THE EXECUTIVE CADRE (SIEC)

EX minus 1 and EX minus 2 level public servants who are ready to build the skills and competencies required to become an executive.

LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM IN SCIENCE AND INNOVATION (LDPSI)

EX-01 (Director level) and EX minus 1 or equivalent in science, technology, and innovation roles, who want to pursue higher executive ranks in the next 2-5 years.

HIGHLIGHTS	Facilitated by former ADMs, VELP provides access to high level speakers, a vast network of peers, self awareness tools, engaging digital and in-person learning, and one-on-one executive coaching. Optional pre-loaded rental laptops are available for use.	Led by digital government expert Ryan Androsoff and designed for public sector executives, DELP covers: design thinking, agile methods, digital technology, data and AI, digital ethics, and leading effective digital teams. Virtual Reality technology and other innovative digital tools are used throughout.	Designed to prepare public servants to become leaders and executives, SIEC combines theory, expert guest speakers, self-awareness tools, group coaching, and experienced facilitators.Participants travel to Montreal for a leadership study tour in Module 3 of the program (Feb. 2024).	Exploring the cultures of science, innovation, and policy and how and where they intersect, work together, and influence Canadian society; and how individuals can impact results. Cohort 21 is a fully in-person cohort held at the IOG office in Ottawa, ON.
